
## STARTS FORM HERE

## THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

The following are amongst the regulations that supplement the WSHO 2009, namely:

• Workplace Safety and Health (Amendment) Order, 2013

Workplace Safety & Health Division, Department of Labour, Ministry of Home Affairs

Currently, the Workplace Safety and Health Division (WSHD) operate within the Department of Labour to ensure that workplace safety and health conditions are at an acceptable standard. As the WSHD is still fostering a safe and healthy culture at workplaces, awareness campaigns are part of an on-going activity in all four districts of Brunei Darussalam. Safety and health seminars are usually carried out during the Department of Labour's road show. The division has the following objectives:

- Workplace Safety and Health (Facilities) (Control of Major Accident Hazards) Regulations, 2013
- Workplace Safety and Health (General Provisions) Regulations, 2014
- Workplace Safety and Health (Construction) Regulations, 2014
- Workplace Safety and Health (Workplace Safety and Health Officers) Regulations, 2014
- Workplace Safety and Health (Workplace Safety and Health Committees) Regulations, 2014
- Workplace Safety and Health (Incident Reporting) Regulations, 2014
- Workplace Safety and Health (Risk Management) Regulations, 2014

- To develop and standardise nationwide policies to improve the working environment
- To provide useful information and conduct awareness campaign on safety and health at the workplace
- To organise a systematic approach on inspection of organisations in Brunei Darussalam
- To support organisations in maintaining and monitoring workplaces
- To support individuals by providing compensation rights to those with work-related injuries and illness
